



Schonesland Driver of the Year Award

Award winners will be the drivers who accumulate the highest point total in each class. Points will be awarded for events sponsored by Schonesland Region only. Only members of our region will be eligble for points.

Trophies will be awarded in two classes: Men's and Ladies. The five autocrosses and two rallies listed in the Calendar of Events are the official events.

Points will be received for a drivers highest finishes in 5 of the 7 events during the season. A driver will receive an additional point for each event competed in over the 5 used in point awarding. Points awarded on class finish will be based on number of drivers in the class for that event. Example: 6 drivers, first place—6 points, second place—5 points Both driver and navigator receive points in rallies. All records will be kept by the Competition Chairman and published monthly in the Spinner.

Autocrossing classes will be divided as follows: Class 1— any 6 cylinder or turbocharged Porsche. Class 2— 4 cylinder Porsches. Class assignment will be made by the Event Chairman.

Tech Tips "GASSIN" WITH THE BEAN"

Spark Plug Terminal Shock!

Spark plug terminal shock, ever had it? No, it's not some unusual electrical malady! It's the moment of panic when you are presented with a \$60 bill for six gleaming, new platinum spark plugs. Factory recommended Bosch 235 P21, 250 P21 and 265 P21 types can run this high. The expert insists that this is what the factory says must be used in your precious 911. At this time you walk away wondering how you are going to justify \$10 spark plugs to the "Keeper of the Coin". Well, take heart, they're not all that necessary. There are several less expensive and very satisfactory alternatives.

First, let's talk about heat ranges. Some plugs are constructed so that it takes a high temperature to make them operate properly so that all the air-fuel mixture ignites completely. This is called a "cold" plug and is used when sustained high speed driving is possible (Autobahn, Brainerd, Heaven, etc.) Platinum plugs fall in this category.

This type does not work too well for the more "real world" kind of driving most of us do. Fuel-air is not properly burned, deposits are left on the plug and the piston, so that the engine misses and sputters. (And I just changed plugs 1000 miles ago!)

What we need is a hotter plug that will operate properly at a lower temperature so that everything burns. Prefect then for around town and moderate speed driving.

There are several good choices in this type of plug. Some popular ones are Bosch 200 T30, NGK BP7ES, and Champion N6Y. Slightly colder would be Bosch 230 T30, NGK BP8ES, and Champion N7Y. All of these manufacturers number plugs so that the higher the number the colder the plug.

Higher compression necessitates the use of colder plugs. The converse is true for lower compression engines. Consequently, later model 911's might need a Bosch 145 T30 or NGK BP5ES.

The same principle applies to 356, 912, 914 and 924 types. If yours has been loading up around town, try a hotter plug. Good choices might be

356—Bosch W200 T35 or NGK BP7ES

912—Bosch W200 T35 or NGK BP7ES

914—Bosch W175 T35 or NGK BP6ES

924—Bosch W175 T35 or NGK BP6ES

Be sure your ignition wires are in good shape and free of oil and grease, too. If while running your car at night your engine compartment looks like the Fourth of July, it's time to replace those wires!





Interpreting the Graph: Bar graph heights show both road range in feet and dBm sensitivity measured in the laboratory. Solid line at the top of each bar shows the value in feet from the radar unit test location to the point at which the detector first reliably triggered. Dotted line shows the R.F. (radio frequency) sensitivity value in - dBm/cm2 for each detector as measured in the laboratory. The long horizontal "Line of Sight" line shows the first point in feet, at which the police radar unit was able to clock the test vehicle. The "Seconds of Safety" axis on the left hand side of the graph shows how many seconds of advanced warning a person would have from the time the detector triggered until a reading was clocked by the radar, assuming a steady speed of 70 m.p.h. To see how many seconds of safety are available for each detector, follow straight across from the solid top of each bar from left to right until the "Seconds of Safety" axis is intersected. Minus seconds indicate "seconds of clocking" by the police radar before the detector triggers
